Customer Spring Safety Tips

Anhydrous Ammonia

- 1. Always wear Anhydrous Ammonia approved Safety Gloves and Goggles.
- 2. **Never** wear contact lens when working with or transporting Anhydrous Ammonia.
- 3. Always close the liquid valve on the ammonia nurse tank when you are on public roadways.
- 4. Be sure hitch pins and clips are in place and in good condition.
- 5. Make sure safety chains are used on the road and in the field.
- 6. Always wear gloves and goggles.
- 7. Never wear contact lens.
- 8. Don't leave tanks in the field over night or for longer periods of time.
- 9. Park tanks out of sight of roads or park them back in the field away from field driveways.
- 10. Steps 8&9 will help prevent drug related thefts and spills resulting from valves left open by thieves.
- 11. Take the extra time to be sure you have safety water with you at all times. If you need this water you will be thankful you made the extra effort.
- 12. Always open valves slowly, check for leaks, or ruptured hoses.
- 13. Take care of our equipment. It helps keep our costs down which helps keep your costs down.
- 14. Check your hose for expiration dates. Replace as needed.
- 15. Be safe on the road. Towing nurse tanks presents additional hazards; an accident involving ammonia could result in tremendous liability, serious injury. BE CAREFUL.
